## New Members Q & A

### Where can I find information about personal perfins and how is their value determined?

By way of background, the latest *Catalog of United States Perfins* (1998) lists security punches for both commercial and personal patterns. At the time the catalog was published, there were 6351 different commercial patterns recorded. In contrast, there were only 65 non-commercial patterns identified.

In that edition of the catalog, reference was made to personal punches as "so-called vanity punches. They were not made for commercial purposes but for personal use by collectors." As we might suspect, over the years there have been several inquiries as to why personal perfins have no ratings.

Two years ago, in an effort to shed some light on the subject of personal perfins, Bob Szymanski (LM#145) undertook a "Census of Unrated Perfins". His survey request was published in the September 2007 issue of *The Perfins Bulletin* (61:186-188). The results of the survey were published in the February 2008 issue of *The Perfins Bulletin* (62:21-

22).

With regard to the value of personal perfins, the accepted standard rate of exchange has been fifty cents for those patterns readily available. In a recent auction, four patterns that were identified as "hard-to-find" (fewer than 10 copies known) in Szymanski's survey, ranged in hammer price from \$29 to \$93.

Because of the recent increased interest in identifying and collecting personal perfins, a checklist of U.S. Personal Perfin Punches has been updated to include all new and deleted patterns through August 2009. Copies are available from Personal Punch Checklist, PO Box 490450, Leesburg FL 34749-0450.

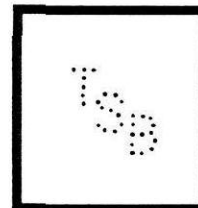

## Rev-Perfins Report - Summer 2009

Art Mongan (LM#3443)

This report contains some of the activities and results associated with the *2007 Catalog of Revenue Perfins* between Summer 2008 and Summer 2009. It also contains future plans aimed at major revisions for a Summer 2010 edition.

I am disappointed at the lack of penetration of the Rev-Perfins Catalog in the collecting communities

outside of the Perfins Cub. About 27 sets sold in the perfins community. The first draft was completed October 2007, a month behind target date. A run of test and working copies of a one volume "Library" edition on 20 pound, three hole paper was made by a commercial printer. Examination of this trial lead to the current three volume configuration.

## Rev-Perfins Report - Summer 2009 (cont.)

Sale of unused copies of the one volume edition covered some of the cost of the printing. After some mail problems, around the end of 2007, a reliable CD of the three volume catalog was sent to Dave Lightle (#3480), Publications Sales Manager, for reproduction. I don't know how many copies Dave has sold.

In April 2008 a three volume version (enlarged check and fiscal paper sections) and advertising flyers were developed. A limited run of test and working copies were made by a commercial printer on 24 pound paper and comb-bound for stamp show literature competitions. A Silver award was received at NAPEX in June 2008. A number of suggestions were made by the three judge panel. These included tighter proof reading, line by line pin counts and measurements, a table of using firms and the associated patterns, and an expanded introduction to perfins including information on the perforators and their makers. Copies of the April 2008 version of the catalog were judged at the American Philatelic Society Summer Show at Hartford in the middle of August 2008 where it received a Vermeil award.

Feedback from the catalog has added one new perforated initials pattern. Monitoring auctions has added an additional perforated initials pattern. A list in the *Bulletin* has confirmed revenue usage of two patterns and identified the revenue stamp type. Activities in the other sections of the catalog are listed along with future plans below.

Ron Leshar (#3498) had an article in the June 2008 issue of *Scott Stamp Monthly* on beer stamps that mentions the handbook once by full title and twice by short title. He states that no serious collector of beer stamps should be without it.

One outstanding problem is how to handle corrections and additions to the catalog. The State Revenue Society is doing this to the new state revenue catalog (about 700 pages) by issuing replacement pages to that catalog as part of the society's quarterly publication. This only gets the new information to society members and not to all buyers of the catalog. The same would occur if corrections and additions were printed as insertable pages in the *Bulletin*.

Major changes to be incorporated in the next edition

include:

- 1) adding a table of values to Section A (perforated initial in transaction revenues),
- 2) adding an aid in identifying dated perforated cancels to Section B (dated perforated cancels in transaction revenues),
- 3) adding a list of attributed firms for the patterns listed in Section A & B,
- 4) complete revision of Section D (punched designs) hopefully to allow rapid finding and comparison of punched designs,
- 5) adding dimensions to Sections K (Checks) and Section L (Fiscal Paper),
- 6) and most contentious, publishing and distributing the Catalog as a CD (with improved navigation as I learn new software).

Major pattern additions and corrections are planned for:

- 1) Section D (punched designs),
- 2) Section E (Beer),
- 3) Section H (Tobacco -mostly cigars),
- 4) Section K (Checks), and
- 5) Section L (Fiscal documents).

Minor pattern additions and corrections occur in the other Sections. The results of research being done in the revenue community on Wine and Liquor revenue stamps will be incorporated if available in time for the estimated May 1, 2010 cutoff date for the next edition.

Future tasks include:

- 1) Develop easy navigation software for the CD editions,
- 2) Tighter proof reading,
- 3) Determine corrections and additions method,
- 4) Continue adding new patterns and corrections to the data base,
- 5) Verify periods of usage,
- 6) Research devices used to perforate or punch the patterns in revenue stamps,
- 7) Expand penetration into other collecting communities, and
- 8) Add measurements to additional sections of the Catalog.

As a side note, I still have tens of thousand of revenue stamps to check for new entries and thousands of stock sales slips to check for new patterns, to verify users, and to establish years of use.

# Schermacks, Perfins and Guide Lines

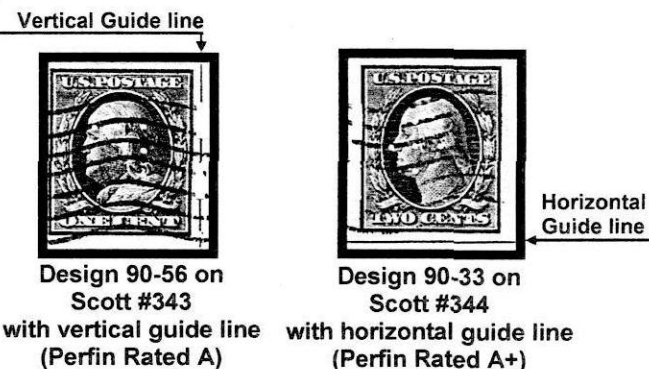
I often find nuances with stamps or perfins that I had not originally appreciated when I go back through my collections and accumulations to reorganize the material. And so it was when I recently was looking at my "Perfins on Schermacks" stamp collection.

I had previously thought, naively and incorrectly, that the Schermacks were cut into strips from 100 stamp sheets. Therefore, I was a bit surprised the other evening when I spotted a vertical line in the margin of a Schermack in my collection.

In checking reference materials, I realized my error. The Schermacks were produced by first trimming the outside margins from panes of 400-subject imperforate panes, close to the stamps on the right edge and about 7mm on the left edge. (These 400 stamp panes had vertical and horizontal guide lines indicating where the large panes should be separated into 100 stamp sheets.) These panes were then pasted together right edge over the left edge tab to form a roll of 150 panes. These long rolls were then given Schermack slot perforations, then slit horizontally and rolled into twenty coils of 3000 stamps each. Vertical guide lines appear every twentieth stamp. Horizontal guide lines are the result of miscut sheeting during the final rolling of coils. The rolls were then run through a machine that applied the distinctive Schermack perforated stamps to envelopes.

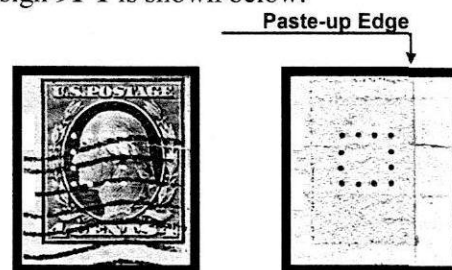
Therefore, I should see more Schermacks with vertical lines on the margin than with horizontal lines on the top or bottom margins. And, of course, I did -- once I looked closer. And I found them in the quantities one would expect. (I am fortunate to have 290 Schermacks with perfins in my possession, so I have a reasonable number - statistically - to run such an analysis). Specifically, one would expect to find 20 stamps with vertical guide lines, and somewhat fewer than 20 with horizontal guide lines for every 400 such stamps collected. For a collection of 290 Schermacks, one would expect to find 14 with vertical lines and less than 14 with horizontal lines. I found 9 verticals and 7 horizontals -- statistically, a very reasonable finding.

Shown below are examples of Schermacks with these two types of guide lines; a vertical guide line on Scott #343 and a horizontal guide line on Scott #344:



We know that the panes were attached, end-to-end, and then cut into 3000 stamp coils with Schermack perforations, resulting in some paste-up pairs. From a 400 stamp pane, one would generate 20 paste-up pairs. Therefore, in my collection of 290 Schermacks, I should find somewhere around 14 stamps with evidence of being part of a paste-up pair.

However, I found only two Schermacks with evidence of being one side of a paste-up pair. Why? After discussion with several collectors, the answer became obvious: as stamp collectors soaked the Schermack stamps off envelopes, they also caused the paste-up edge to separate from the attached stamp. An example of a single stamp from a paste-up pair of Scott #346 that has been perfined with Design 91-1 is shown below.

(Less than 20 copies of Scott #346 with any 12-hole Schermack perfin design are estimated to exist today.)

## Schermacks, Perfins and Guide Lines (cont.)

Finally, there are center guide line blocks in these 400 stamp panes. There can be a maximum of 2 stamps from each sheet that show both the vertical and the horizontal guide lines. In my collection, therefore, statistically I might be lucky to find one or two. But alas, I found none with perfins. Check your collections – perhaps you are fortunate to have one!

Note that although I have loosely used the term “pair” here to describe the manufacturing process of Schermacks, please understand that in practice we

will find no postally used Schermack pairs, paste-up or otherwise. During the affixing process, the Schermack machine pulled the coil of Schermack-perforated stamps forward, punched the Schermack perfin and then immediately sliced the stamp from the coil and affixed it to an envelope. Therefore, when found as pairs, such Schermack pairs are the result of a philatelic favor.

I will be offering all of the duplicates from my collection for sale at the Vermont convention in August 2010.

## British Bechuanaland Update

Bob Szymanski’s article in the September/October 2009 *Bulletin* (63:107) reminded me of a British Bechuanaland perfined stamp that I own. It was included in a small collection of British Africa perfins that I purchased about five years ago.

The stamp appears to be a British Bechuanaland Scott #34 with a black overprint on a Great Britain #113. With the help of Maurice Harp, Editor *G.B. Perfins Society Bulletin*, the perfin was identified as pattern **K039.01** in the “Tomkins Perfin Catalog”. Maurice further states that the user for this pattern is Kelly & Co., a Directories company who has nothing to do with British



Bechuanaland.

To help answer the questions about the authenticity of this stamp, Maurice then forwarded a scan of the stamp to Tony Stanford, Secretary of the GB Overprints Society. As discussed in Tony’s article on the next page (page 136), it appears the overprint on this stamp and the one in the previous *Bulletin* article are bogus and were probably applied after the British stamps were perfined. There was no attempt or thought of creating a “fraudulent” perfin, just an inexpensive “space filler”.

## “World’s Greatest Hobby”

This discovery shown above came about while I was looking through a large quantity of British Machins (Scott #MH1 and following) for perfined Regional issues. . . Northern Ireland, Scotland, etc.

If this obliteration is a postmark, the date is missing.

Fortunately, the “overprinting” is on a perfined stamp: SB/C.

The meaning is simple. If philately is the **World’s Greatest Hobby**, then for members of our club, perfins are the holeiest branch of that hobby!

## Bogus Overprints on Great Britain Perfins

It was common practice up to the beginning of the First World War for dealers to apply crude overprints to poor specimens of GB stamps which were sold cheaply to collectors wanting to fill spaces in their pre-printed albums with stamps that were not available in large quantities and which they could not otherwise afford. These stamps are not forgeries as they were not meant to deceive serious collectors and are better referred to as bogus overprints, produced in large quantities for the so-called "packet trade". They frequently feature perfins, which in that epoch were regarded as being worthless. Some of these overprints may look correct at first glance, but the "wrong" cancel is the first indicator that the overprint needs a closer inspection as it is probably bogus.

A typical example of such a bogus overprint is the British Bechuanaland stamp described in Bob Szymanski's article in the September/October *Bulletin* (63:107). In this case each line of the overprint is too short, the spacing between the two lines of the overprint is too short and the bottom line is not horizontal. The blurred cancel is not identifiable and possibly of fiscal origin.

A similar example of a bogus British Bechuanaland overprint on a GB perfin is illustrated below. [Editor's note: This is stamp submitted by Dave Smith described on page 139.] In this case the two

lines of the overprint are a bit too far apart and are not strongly defined and some of the characters are not correct, particularly "BECH". Also, there were no oval registered cancels used in Bechuanaland during the British period. Furthermore the overprints are not horizontal, and across a pane or sheet any small deviation from horizontal can lead to major varieties.

As a additional comment on Bob Szymanski's previously referenced article, mail from the West African colonies went on the Liverpool Packet and any uncanceled stamps would get a Liverpool cancel on arrival. This is illustrated by the postal stationery card from the Oil Rivers shown below. The card has a Bonny River dispatch mark dated 19 October 1893 and the stamp cancelled with the barred oval 466 of Liverpool with Liverpool Packet receiving mark dated 21 November alongside. I believe I have seen similar Zululand items with the Liverpool Packet mark.

## Picking Apple(s) Green(s)

Jerry Hejduk (LM#3710)

In the philatelic world, there is probably no greater example of perseverance and pride than that of issue collecting. In such a pursuit, the collector has identified the intrinsic values of rarity and beauty that propels him to gather and display as many specimens as humanly possible. Such an identification is what motivates the collector of apple greens, the attractive 13¢ US postage stamp of the early 1900's.



Because there were three different green 13¢ stamps issued between 1909 and 1926, one has to be careful to distinguish the only one that is “apple green” in color. It is clearly not the 13¢ Benjamin Harrison (SC #622) of 1926. It will also not suffice to say it's the green 13¢ Washington/Franklin, because there are two of them. The earlier 1910 13¢ Washington/Franklin (SC #365) was a perf. 12, Washington head, blue green in color, with a very limited printing on bluish paper. The other, more attractive Washington/Franklin is the 13¢ 1917 perf. 11 apple green Franklin head (SC#513).

### *The Issue of Rarity/Scarcity*

On November 21, 1917, the letter rate of postage was raised to three cents. The registry and special delivery rate (10¢) remaining unchanged, thus there was once more a real need for thirteen-cent stamps. However, due to the inefficiency of the Post Office Department, almost a year and a half passed before the necessary thirteen-cent denomination was issued on January 10, 1919. At the time the 13¢ stamp finally appeared, it had already been decided that the letter rate would be reduced to two cents and on July 1, 1919, the order went into effect, thereby eliminating the need for a 13¢ stamp. Because of the short time this value was a necessity, it is now almost as desirable a collectable used, as in mint condition. Between the time the stamp was issued and the date of reduction in letter rates, almost as

many were used as during the following five fiscal years. Further, because most of these stamps were used as single copies, used blocks of four are probably as desirable as a collectable as those in mint condition.

### *The Precancel Variety*

The earliest known compilation of apple greens is found in “Oddities in Precancels” by William H. Field and “Checklist of 13 Cent Varieties” by G. Ward Disbrow, MD published in the early 1920's by Rotnem-Danielson, Minneapolis, Minnesota. Because the checklist contained three different 13¢ varieties: the 1902 purple black (SC #308); the 1908 blue green (SC #365); and the 1917 apple green (SC #513), the apple greens had to be teased out of the listing—of which there were 123.

The first Scott #513 13¢ Apple Green Precancel Catalog was edited and priced by Joseph S. Einstein and published by Manley L. Behrens in 1981. They recorded 871 towns and 1375 types; somewhat more than 40 of which they found questionable to some degree. However, they stated that they could not discard the questionable ones out of hand, and acknowledged that there were some towns or types that they had not located.

The latest, and most definitive “13 Cent 1917 Apple Green Catalog of Precancels” was published by Mike Gutman in 2006 and provided some 2650 listings. Revisiting the rarity issue again, it is interesting to note that no cover has been found with a single precancelled 13¢ apple green stamp that was posted during the official usage period of January 10, 1919 to July 1, 1919.

### *The Perfined Precancel Variety*

A review of Randall & Cumming's 1991 Edition of the *Catalog of Perfined Precancels of the United States*, indicated that approximately 1% of the known precancelled apple green types listed in Gutman have been perfined. Because the number is so small, and they have yet to be separately listed, they are identified in the table shown on the next page.

### *The Perfin Variety*

A reasonable search of the perfin literature has not yielded a list of, or an article about, the 13-cent apple greens. Perfin patterns found, other than the ones listed above in perfined precancels, are few in number. Such patterns known to the author include: A229, B092, C253, E124, F066, F161, F172, G152, G172, H032, I91.1, M106B, M164, M184, N043, O012, W021, W084, W111, and No.6.

### *Summary: Tough Picking*

The information presented above about this attractive, hard-to-find stamp is not meant to be an exhaustive in-depth study, but rather an overview of the parameters of one of the smaller niche philatelic collectables. Collectors with additional information/knowledge about other known, but not recorded, examples of apple greens are encouraged to be forthcoming so that the database might be enhanced. ## The Perfins of Mexico - Part 2

The following is the continuation of my article in the September/October 2009 *Bulletin* (63:114-120) about the perfins of Mexico. This time we will discuss the their Officials, Punches and Specimen perfins.

The "C" prefixes are being used for perfins that are considered to be "Officials". This category may be moved to the "A" prefixes (Postal issues) at a later date as the *World Perfins Catalog* editor may decide to include "Official" usages with the "Commercial" usages.

The "P" prefixes are used for the various "Punches" that appear almost entirely on Revenue issues. This is probably only the tip of the iceberg for punches on Revenues. I have only been pursuing them for the past ten years, so I am sure others have been or will be found.

The "S" prefixes are used for the "Specimen" perfins used by the various Stamp and Stationery

manufacturers.

The only Dates of Usage that I know at the present time are 1929 and onward for pattern C1 and 1899 - 1920 for pattern C2.

There have been a number of later issues (1975 - 1993) that have been showing up on eBay with pattern M6 "Muestra" perfin (Spanish for Sample or Specimen). There is much speculation among the MEPSI (Mexico Elmhurst Philatelic Society International) club as to the authenticity of these perfins. It is speculated that either a collector or employee of the National Printery has been getting access to this perforator for philatelic purposes, which should only have been used many years prior to World War II. The MEPSI collectors are trying to get to the bottom of this particular issue. If they are successful, they will advise us. Unfortunately, I do not have an image of pattern M6 to include in this article.

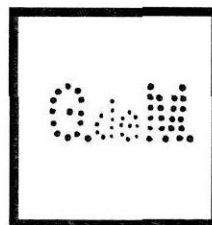

The fancy New Years Card shown in the September/October 2009 *Bulletin* (63:112) reminded me of a card (shown below) that another collector gave to me a few years back because my name is in it.

The card is franked with the 1-cent 1902 (Scott #300) and the postmark shows a 1908 cancel with no date of use. It is addressed to Mr. B.J. Brightman, Genoa, NY. The stamp is perfined with pattern **I107**, (I)T(C)(o), International Tailoring Company, New York, NY.

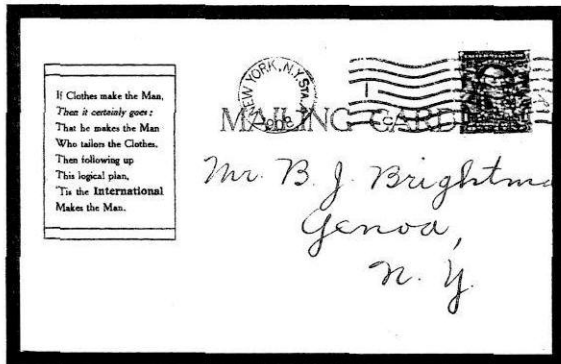
The backside is a foldout titled "A Thanksgiving Offering." The colorful photo shows a young boy with an ax as big as he is, leading a turkey to (guess)? Inside is an offering for nearly 500 fabrics from all over the world for custom designed suits, overcoats etc. The local dealer for the clothing is

identified as D.W. Smith, Genoa, N.Y. I believe this is the same David W. Smith, age 34, who at that time ran a general store in Genoa with his wife Mae.

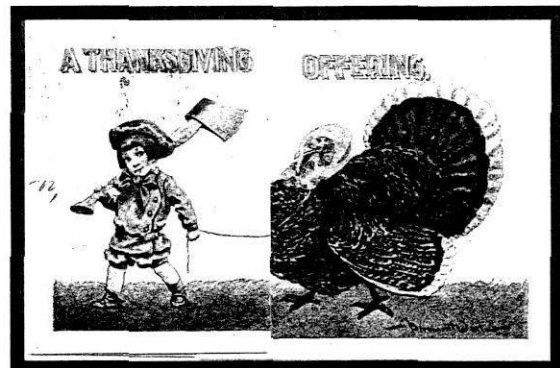
In 1908 Berton (Burton) J. Brightman was 36 years old and engaged in selling farm implements. His wife Edith was also 36, though a little older than him. As Bert was born in November, this card could double as a Birthday card.

While the name is the same, David W. Smith of Genoa is no known relative of mine. My Smith ancestors settled in Chautauqua County, NY about 1820.

## My Favorite Perfins – Part VII

Steve Endicott (LM#2284)

This issue of my favorite and most unusual U.S. perfins discusses the area of perfins on stamps with Kansas or Nebraska overprints, which was an important portion of the display at the St. Louis convention. As many of you know, perfins on these overprints is one of my very favorite collecting subjects.

The Kansas and Nebraska overprints were produced on the rotary press to document that the stamps were being sent to post offices for sale in Kansas and Nebraska. This was being done as an experiment to thwart theft from shipments of stamps to post offices. If successful, the program might have been expanded to every State. Some people mistakenly believed, then and now, that the stamps could only be used in Kansas and Nebraska – not true. The confusion, even amongst postal staff, led to a quick discontinuation of the program.

The first two pages of this portion of the exhibit provide examples of the University of Kansas perfin pattern **U39** (U(K)) on the Kansas overprint series. Examples of all stamps in the set are shown here with **U39**, except the 3-cent Lincoln. The second page illustrates two multiple blocks of this perfin on

this Kansas overprint. Finally, the third page is an example of a usage of the Nebraska overprint with perfin pattern **W199-3** (WU), Western Union Telegraph Company – as used in Minnesota.

Those desiring to read more about perfins on these overprint issues are referred to my previously published articles in the February 2000 *Bulletin* (54:19, 30-32) and in March 2007 issue of *The American Philatelist* (121:236-239).

There is a current, active request in the *Bulletin* for census information regarding stamps with perfins on these overprints. Interestingly, each time this census is conducted (this is the third one in 27 years), new patterns are discovered and previously known patterns disappear.

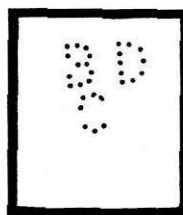

This imperforate stamp is on Scott #481, not Scott #343 as stated in the article. (The denomination is a numeral 1, not the word “one”.) My mistake. I apologize for any confusion.

Dave also forwarded a scan of perfinned imperforate stamp that he has in his collection. The stamp pictured below is example of deleted pattern **B86.5** (BD/C) on a Scott #384. As explained on page B-16 of the current *Catalog of United States Perfins*, pattern **B86.5** is a partial of pattern **B88** (BD/Co). In The identified user of this B rated pattern is Brown Durrell Company, Boston, MA.

(Partial of Pattern **B88**)

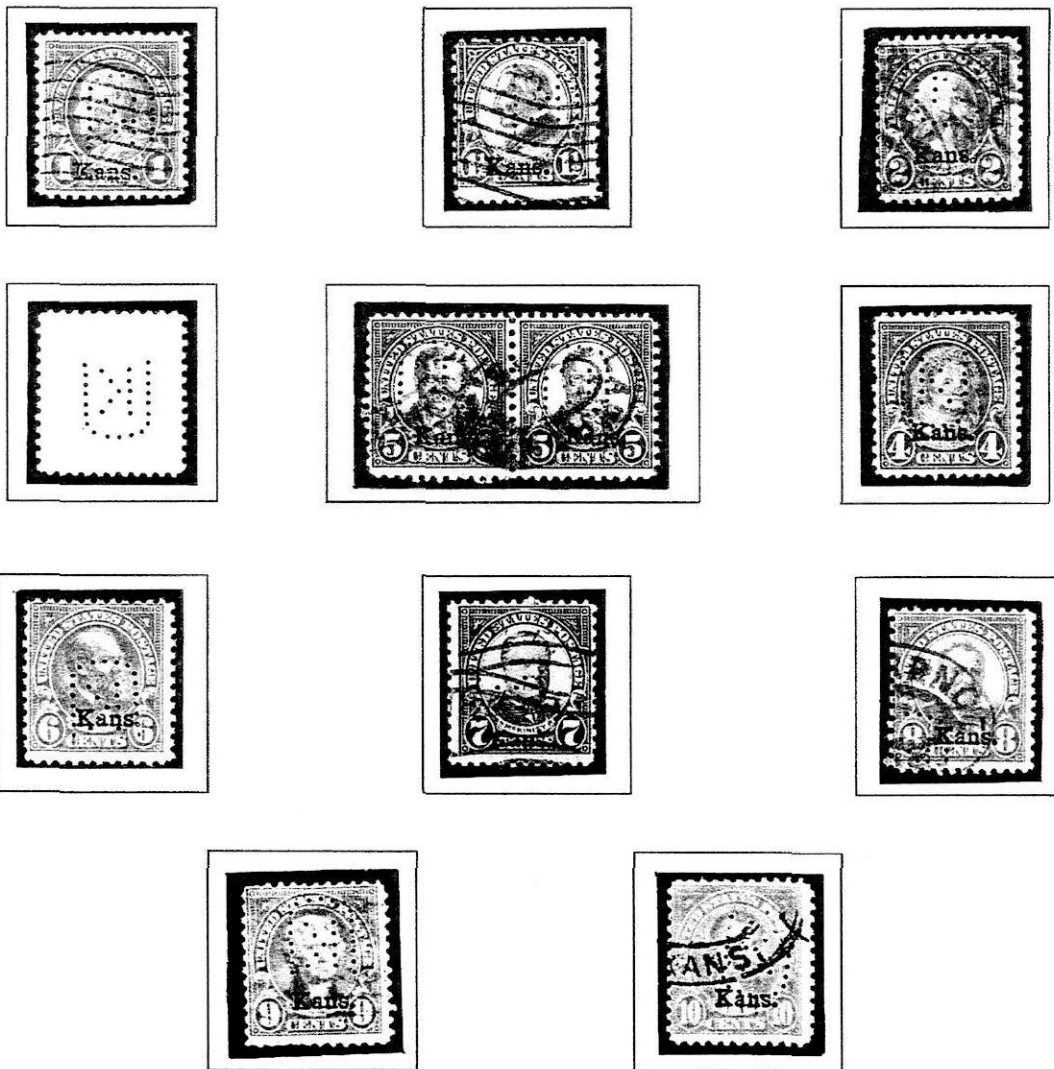

### Perfins on Kansas / Nebraska Overprint Issues

As some of you know, my personal favorite collection area is Kansas and Nebraska overprints with perfins. Only 38 perfin patterns have been seen on these two overprinted issues. Less than 200 stamps in these two issues have been documented to include perfins.

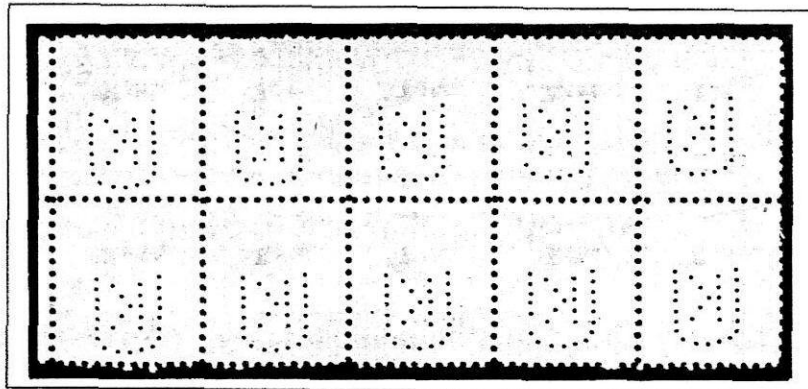
One of the institutions to perfin the Kansas overprint issue was the University of Kansas. Shown here is the entire issue (minus the 3 cent Lincoln) with the University of Kansas perfin "UK" cataloged as U39.

### Multiples of Perfins on Kansas / Nebraska Overprint Issues

Very few multiples of the Kansas and Nebraska overprints with perfins have been found. The largest multiple that I know of is the mint block of 10 on Scott 664 with the University of Kansas perfin U39 shown here. This perfin was used extensively by the University of Kansas from 1908 to 1963, after which the University changed to a slightly different perfin pattern.





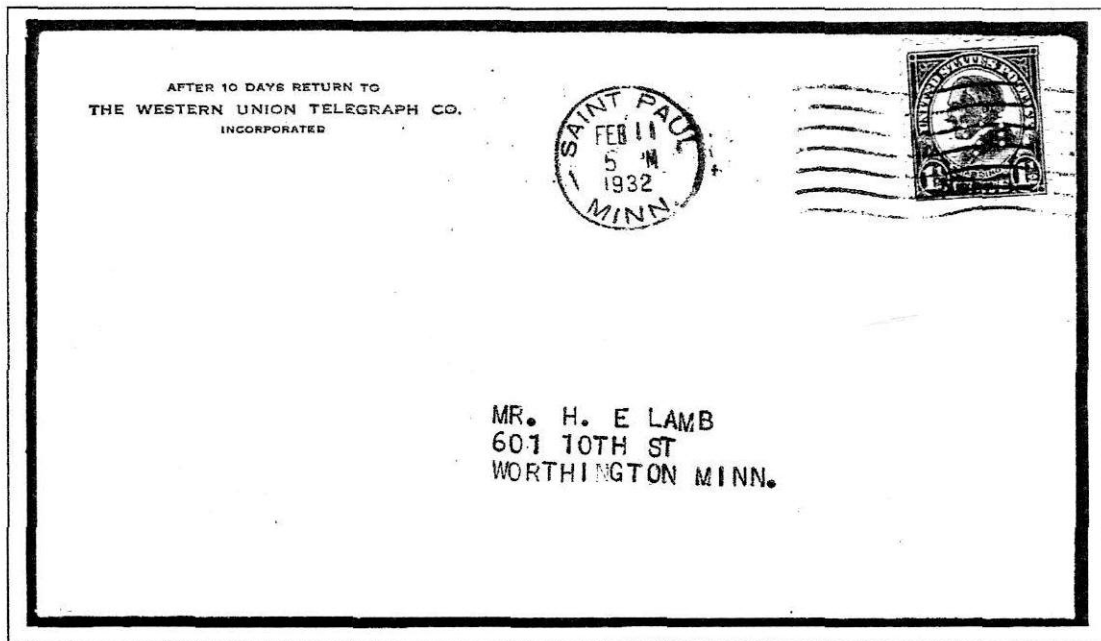

### Cover with Perfins on Kansas / Nebraska Overprint Issues

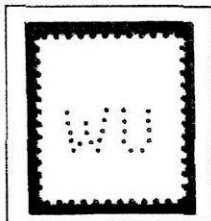
The Kansas and Nebraska overprints were issued as a means thwarting stolen postage stamps on route to or in post offices in Kansas and Nebraska. Although the stamps were valid uses of postage throughout the United States, the thinking at the Department of the Post Office was that most usage would occur in Kansas and Nebraska, making it difficult to fence large supplies elsewhere. The legitimate use of these stamps was widely misunderstood, even amongst postal employees.

Below is one of the few known covers documenting use of the Kansas / Nebraska overprinted stamps with perfins in locations other than Kansas or Nebraska. This cover was mailed from the Western Union Telegraph office in Saint Paul, Minnesota to Mr. Lamb in Worthington, Minnesota, with a 1.5 cent Harding stamp, overprinted Nebraska, and with a Western Union Telegraph perfin.

### BLOCK OF 11- "C153.5" (deleted) & "C154"

Bob Szymanski (LM#145)

For those who know that I collect the 11 cent Polk Prexies by issue, no this is not a block of James Polks! But, what it is, is very interesting indeed.

In the 1966 US Perfin Catalog a "CHM" was listed as pattern **C153.5** and duly noted as the top line of pattern **C154** "CHM/Co". During the course of time and fine tuning of what would or would not be considered a new perfin pattern, **C153.3** was deleted.

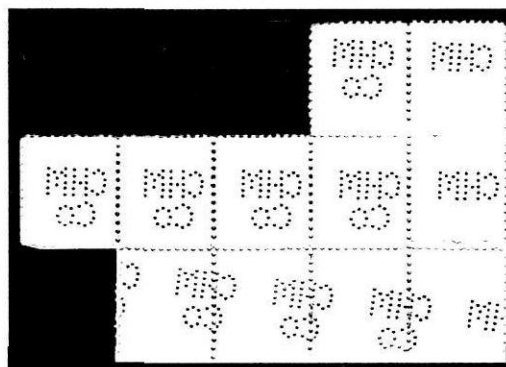
Shown are the front and reverse sides of the type of non-rectangular block that would have led to such a decision by the US Catalog editor. This block does tell us a number of things. Because of the spacing of the punches, this is either a 5 or 10 head perforator.

The bottom row of perfin punches is so out of kilter that this was hand fed by someone not paying complete attention to the job. The right vertical row shows the "CHM", so that particular head was without the "Co". Why? Induction leads me to believe that the "Co" was damaged in some manner and a decision was made to remove all the pins to these two letters rather than the try to fix defective or missing pins.

A common but interesting interest item it is! A cursory look at any blocks of perfin that you may possess might give the collecting community more interesting information. Hurry up and get out that box of perfins and take another look!

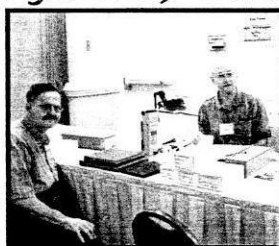
